OUR Commitment

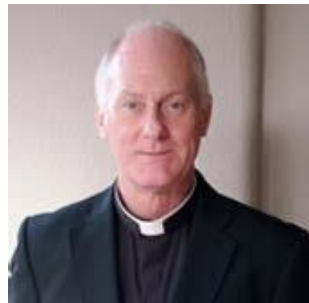
- Promoting a safer environment and culture
