## FIRST READING : 2 Corinthians 6-1-13

As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. **2** For he says, 'At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you.' See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! **3** We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, **4** but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, **5** beatings, imprisonments, riots, labours, sleepless nights, hunger; **6** by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, **7** truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; **8** in honour and dishonour, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; **9** as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see - we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; **10** as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything. **11** We have spoken frankly to you Corinthians; our heart is wide open to you. **12** There is no restriction in our affections, but only in yours. **13** In return—I speak as to children—open wide your hearts also.

**35** On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, 'Let us go across to the other side.' **36** And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. **37** A great gale arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. **38** But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, 'Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?' **39** He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!' Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. **40** He said to them, 'Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?' **41** And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, 'Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?'

## Old Testament Reading : 1 Samuel 17:1a, 4-11, 19-23, 32-49 (not used in the Morning Service,)

**17** Now the Philistines gathered their armies for battle; they were gathered at Socoh, which belongs to Judah, and encamped between Socoh and Azekah, in Ephes-dammim. **4** And there came out from the camp of the Philistines a champion named Goliath, of Gath, whose height was six\* cubits and a span. **5** He had a helmet of bronze on his head, and he was armoured with a coat of mail; the weight of the coat was five thousand shekels of bronze. **6** He had greaves of bronze on his legs and a javelin of bronze slung between his shoulders. **7** The shaft of his spear was like a weaver's beam, and his spear's head weighed six hundred shekels of iron; and his shield-bearer went before him. **8** He stood and shouted to the ranks of Israel, 'Why have you come out to draw up for battle? Am I not a Philistine, and are you not servants of Saul? Choose a man for yourselves, and let him come down to me. **9** If he is able to fight with me and kill me, then we will be your servants; but if I prevail against him and kill him, then you shall be our servants and serve us.' **10** And the Philistine said, 'Today I defy the ranks of Israel! Give me a man, that we may fight together.' **11** When Saul and all Israel heard these words of the Philistine, they were dismayed and greatly afraid.

**19** Now Saul, and they, and all the men of Israel, were in the valley of Elah, fighting with the Philistines. **20** David rose early in the morning, left someone in charge of the sheep, took the provisions, and went as Jesse had commanded him. He came to the encampment as the army was going forth to the battle line, shouting the war cry. **21** Israel and the Philistines drew up for battle, army against army. **22** David left the things in charge of the keeper of the baggage, ran to the ranks, and went and greeted his brothers. **23** As he talked with them, the champion, the Philistine of Gath, Goliath



by name, came up out of the ranks of the Philistines, and spoke the same words as before.
